Jerry lives in the Activity Center at Stable Hands, so you may have seen him if you've been to our center. Jerry can be used to work on rider fitness and physical fitness training for equestrians and athletes of all kinds! Rather than 4 legs, Jerry has wheels that make him easy to move around. Jerry also has a spring mechanism that allows him to move similarly to a horse when stimulated by the rider's muscle movement. At Stable Hands, Jerry is used for all sorts of things! Riders who are unable to ride a live horse can use Jerry to practice grooming, tacking, mounting, riding, holding the reins, and so much more! Jerry can be used to work to gain the strength and balance needed to ride a live equine. Jerry also loves getting to know the public and teaching kids at our fundraising events!
